Sometimes a love affair begins at first sight and then there are those that grow with you over time. My first car was a 1950 Chevy hardtop that had been a present when I graduated from high school. When I graduated from college in 1963, it was time for a new car. Chevys dominated our family in those days and I just naturally leaned toward another one. The Corvair Monza Spyder caught my eye and nothing else would do. This two door, rear engine, I50HP turbo charged six with four on the floor was nothing short of amazing to me and I loved that car. It was fun to drive and would fly when you put your foot into it. When April 1964 came around and the Mustang was introduced at the World's Fair, I was impressed but still in love with the Corvair. I would see the new Mustangs on the road and thought they were a neat looking car but had no real desire to own one. Ralph Nader hadn't started to bad mouth the Corvair yet and I was having too much fun enjoying life. You see, I had just married my high school sweetheart Sue in 1964, yes, the same girl I'm still married to. Some things do last forever.

Jumping ahead several years and after three and a half years with the Army and two children, we bought our first Ford, a 1967 LTD. That was the end of the Chevy line for me. The Mustang was still out there and looking good but in those days, the word practical still ruled life decisions. After 1973, the Mustang II was born. I loved the new body style but its size was just too small for a family of four. So we cruised through the 70's in a Ford Club Wagon. Along came 1979 and the Fox body was born. Wow, I was impressed but still too small for a family car.

Another jump ahead to 1983 and we were at the point where we could afford two cars and since both the children were driving, it just made sense to me. Ever since I saw the first Fox body, the Mustang had always been in the back of my mind. It was just right for a second car and why not order a new one. Six weeks later, we took delivery from Wayne Ford on a red '83 hatch back, four





speed, 2.3L four cylinder Mustang. Bad choice of engines even though I loved the car. With two teenagers driving, I knew the 5.0 V8 was out of the question. So we settled on the four and learned to love it.

Now I was really hooked on Mustangs and our son and daughter loved them, too. I persevered with the lack of horse power for three years while a lot of miles rolled up on that car. The engine started to get very noisy and that was the excuse I needed to look for another one with a bigger engine.

I found a 1984 convertible with a 3.8 V6 and low mileage. This would be the first convertible in our life and WOW, where have you been?!! This one was red too with a color called canyon red and a black top. It also had an automatic transmission, much to my disappointment, but other than that I loved it. That car was so much fun to drive and take trips in. I didn't have a garage to keep it in but it was always shined and covered. The love affair was beginning to blossom. By 1994, that car had over 100,000 miles on it and even though it was still running beautifully, it was time to start looking for a replacement.

That didn't take long when I passed the Ford dealer in Collegeville on Memorial Day weekend and spotted a triple white GT convertible on the used car lot. The car was spotless, so I called the dealer the next day and the rest is history. It too was an automatic but I didn't care. I joined VFMC and the '91 became my show car. The highlight of that car was having it photographed at Carlisle for a book that was being written called the Fox-Body Mustang Recognition Guide. Being in the book when it was published just immortalized the car. The GT was pampered and fussed over just like the other two before it, but



by 2003, it had a lot of miles on it and it was time to replace it. I loved the new body style called the SN95 and ordered a new black one to my specifications. This time it had to have a standard transmission



and of course it had to be a convertible. The old reliable 5.0 was gone, but the new 4.6L was fun to drive. Who knows how long I'll have this one in the stable? This Mustang is an occasional driver only or when we go on a trip and want to drive the fun car. Will there be another 5.0 in the future? Maybe----because the love affair lives on!



Jack it Up!!

I've always been nervous about getting under cars. I never had the room for a "real" lift so I have always used floor jacks followed by jackstands. I do this really carefully, not like Homer Simpson who used a wicker hamper to hold his car up, or the fellow in the other picture who used 2 by 4s to hold his truck up while welding underneath! While I've never had anything close to an accident I never really trusted this set up either.



I recently found a great solution for lifting a car in the air (and having it remain there!) safely on the web site myliftstand.com. You can see videos of these stands on youtube.com, just search for myliftstand. The concept is that you jack the car up and then place the stand under a tire. Then you jack up the other side of the car and place another stand under that tire. At that point the bottom of the tires are 6.5 inches off the ground, so there's a lot of clearance under the car. But if you feel like you need even more space, the beauty of these stands is that you can lift them up another 7 inches by placing a floor jack under the upper portion of the stand and lifting up. A ratchet bar catches and holds the bottom of the tires a full 13 inches off the ground. That's enough room to do almost anything under the car.

The myliftstand.com lifts cost \$265.00 per pair, and shipping to Worcester was about \$68.00, so a set of 4 cost me about \$665.00. While that's by no means cheap, they are very well made and will hold 2000 pounds on each stand. As you can see in the picture my son grabbed these the moment the packages showed up and they have been holding his Miata up ever since! But what these stands don't address is how







to take the wheels off when you have the car in the air. I found a unique answer to that problem on Jay Leno's youtube channel, the Jackpoint jack stands which you can find on jackpointjackstands.com. These clever stands have a jack pad that you place on top of your floor jack. You jack the car up at the factory specified jacking point with the jack pad on top of the floor jack, and when you get the car up to about 14 inches in the air, you slip the jack stand around the jack pad and lower the car and jack pad onto the jack stand. You then remove the floor jack and the jack pad and jack stand remain holding the car at the correct jacking point. The video on the Jay Leno's Garage youtube channel features the Jackpoint's developer showing the operation of the stand and telling the story of how he developed them. Again, these aren't cheap at \$339.00 a pair plus about \$50.00 shipping, but now I feel I can safely lift any of my cars in any situation, and that's worth a lot to me.

Speaking of solving problems, a couple of months ago I bought an assortment of worm gear hose clamps at Harbor Freight. Guess what, they turned out to be crap, they strip out if you try to tighten them down. Who knew Harbor Freight sold poor quality parts? Yeah, it came as a surprise to me too. But I liked the idea of having whatever size hose clamp I need because it always seems that I find I need another one just after the auto parts store closes! Well a few clicks at summitracing.com netted me this fine collection of assorted Dayco hose clamps delivered to my door in just a few days. Problem solved - these are wonderful days in which we live!


Now everything was not perfect, I thought IMS concessions were overprized and if I had to do it again I would have paid to take a couple of laps on the track.

I big Thank You goes out to the MCA, the MCA clubs, and all the people that made this Birthday Celebration possible.




